## Bishop's Lent Appeal 2017

Each year, the Bishop of Portsmouth organises a Lent Appeal to help one local and one global good cause. Worshippers from our diocese donate money and hold fundraising events to support those charities.

The Bishop's Lent Appeal 2017 will raise money to help survivors of sex trafficking across the world, as well as local victims of domestic abuse. We've called this year's appeal 'From Slavery to Freedom'.

The money raised will be split between 'Stop The Traffik', which is a global movement of activists who try to prevent human trafficking, and local charities that support victims of domestic abuse.

Bishop Christopher said: "We take our many freedoms for granted; but for far too many, human trafficking has turned their lives into a living hell where their work or their bodies are exploited for others' gain. As we focus on this issue of human trafficking, we will also focus on local charities in the diocese that are preventing and responding to the mistreatment of women and girls. I was fortunate to grow up in a home free from domestic violence. This is sadly not the case for too many in our communities. This year, we stand in solidarity with all who live under the cloud of domestic abuse."

Last year's appeal raised £23,110 which was split between the St Nicholas Theological Seminary in Ghana, which trains ordinands for the Anglican Church in Ghana, and local charities that help those who experience obstacles to learning.

'Stop The Traffik' is a coalition of charities which seeks to prevent trafficking via education to empower individuals to take action, global campaigning for change, and sharing knowledge and information of where trafficking is taking place. We will be considering the issues in the Bishop's Lent Appeal at the Parish Eucharist on 19<sup>th</sup> March, and there will be an opportunity to give at the Lent Lunch that day.

# **Guide Dog Puppies—Indy and Ned**

Our last 'pupdate' saw Indy and Ned beginning their Advanced Training to become Guide Dogs.

Unfortunately, Indy had several issues which could not be ironed out. For example, he was getting stressed at having to make his own decisions and so



Guide Dogs withdrew him from training. On the plus side though, as his puppy walkers, we (John and Barbara) had first refusal to rehome him and so Indy is now back with us as a much loved pet. The decision was not a hard one! This means, however, that for the foreseeable future we are unable to have another puppy.

Ned, on the other hand, is still making progress and has been matched with a person who is also profoundly deaf. Ned will initially go to Hearing Dogs for a few months for training before returning to the Guide Dogs to train with his new owner.

You will have realised that Lyndsey has another puppy called Marius and she has asked for the same rules to be applied to him so please ignore him during a service.
